1 Peter 3:15-16

Welcome to the March edition of Street Jesus e news. In contrast to last years 'Beast from the east' we are enjoying some of the warmest February weather ever, with temperature records being set in many parts of the country. This week has seen people sun bathing on the beach and skiing virtually brought to a halt in Scotland badly affecting the local tourist economy there. Global warming has recently moved children to stage demonstrations in school time and as they rightly say it is their future that is going to be adversely affected if the doomsday scenario of Global warming comes true. Plastic pollution particularly in the sea has also been receiving a lot of attention and the decline in many species due to loss of habitat and pollutants is a source of great concern.

I read recently that Christians are less likely to be concerned about current environmental issues because we are more interested in the hereafter rather than the here and now.

Yet there are many Christian environmental groups dedicated to preserving our creation because God in the bible has given us stewardship over the Earth. It is here for us to enjoy and we are to look after it. In the same way that we get a foretaste of heaven on earth when we connect with God we too get a hint of the renewed heaven and earth when we care for it.

We had a very interesting outreach at Leiston recently and although we were unable to put up the Gazebo and sell African crafts because of the very windy weather we did do a bucket collection and handed out a large number of Beehive flyers. The subject of Israel came up in

conversation and culturally their treatment of the Palestinians comes in for a fair bit of criticism. We rarely hear of the other side of the argument in our media but is quite well documented online. The subject of antisemitism is very much in the news with the labour party having a particular problem with some sections of its membership. Labour

MP's have recently left the party because the problem has not been dealt with properly. Throughout history the Jews have been persecuted with the Holocaust being the most dramatic example in recent times. Why is this? We pray for peace in the middle east and for Gods will to be done and that his promises and purposes will be fulfilled.

Another conversation centred around nature of the Bible with the idea that it is not from God but rather written solely by humans. In 2 Timothy 3:16 we are told that scripture is God breathed or

inspired. This is a hard concept if you do not have a faith because there is no discernible personal experience of God, so such an idea seems bizarre and fanciful. It is only when we pray over scripture that we 'inspire' the word which then inspires us.

We were working in Leiston amidst tragic circumstances. The week before a young 20 year old man had died in a fire in a disused out building on the Victory road field. That day St Margarets church was opened with people available to offer spiritual support to those affected by the tragedy. A number of young people came along to share how they felt.

This kind of contact is so important because the vast majority of people who come to enjoy faith do so through contact with a Christian who show love

Some however have a more direct experience of God. We were very heartened by a story of a man who some years previously had gone down the wide path that led to his destruction. He had reached rock bottom before he cried out to God in desperation. He experienced an overwhelming feeling of Gods love and a little later gave his life to Christ.

We had many more conversations during the day and collected £82 for the Beehive Nakuru Kenya.

In April we will again be holding one of our bi-annual yard sale here at 7 Featherbroom Gardens in Wickham Market in aid of the Beehive.
