Welcome to the September edition of Street Jesus e-news. With the summer drifting away we begin to feel a certain dampness in the air and many of our beautiful plants in the garden are losing colour and life and our lawns have lost that lovely lush green look. The weather and seasons are always changing, each season brings its own characteristics, with some joy and some challenges. Our Christian life is also subject to the same. Our callings can change over time as we experience different seasons in the spirit. We can get into a groove of ministry and feel very comfortable with it but sometimes God wants us to change direction and take on a new challenge. This can be difficult particularly if we are enjoying the work we are doing. But we must be open to God's promptings and be prepared to change.



We had a very enjoyable outreach at the Wickham Market summer market in early August. We are seen here enjoying a lolly. It was nice to be gifted these particularly as we had just done our traditional



handing out of the chocolates which were as ever gratefully received. Many anticipate the chocolates now and even ask after them. We enjoyed lots of good conversations. We had four people who went through 'Jesus as the door', all listened intently. We were able to invite three people to Church here in Wickham Market, one of whom attended the following

day. We offered a listening ear to people or family members who are suffering significant ill health. People often feel awkward when we ask to pray with them in public but rarely refuse our offer to pray for them at other times. We were greatly encouraged by Christian visitors from other churches who gave us pointers on how we could better present ourselves. We are always grateful for constructive points on how we can improve what we do. We handed out free bibles and many young visitors took our animal cards, each of which contain a bible verse. We have noticed recently the increasing number of young people interested in bibles. This is very encouraging. The best moment of the day was when a young boy came along and prayed to Jesus. We had conversations about the Beehive and raised £40 from selling Jewellery. Our next outreach is on the Hill at Wickham Market for the Saturday market on September 21st.



We are continuing to pray on a regular basis, most days for God to bring somebody to us, that we may be able to share Jesus with them. It's been remarkable the increase in contacts we have had. Not all Christians are evangelists but we are all called to share our faith in

some way, this more often requires us building up a relationship with somebody, earning their trust. Hopefully they can identify us by our deeds, that we are Christians. At some point though we have to speak about Jesus, to share him and explain the benefits of the Christ life. This can be most difficult for the people we know best.

Our online work remains as interesting as ever. Recently there has been comment on the authenticity of the bible, the naming of Jesus and the Churches involvement in slavery. Its important for the Church to recognise when it has got things wrong and repent. There is however much disinformation and poor understanding of the bible. We aim to gently correct that which is false. Its important to challenge blatant lies and present instead Christian truth. What resides in the mind can be a real barrier and we must knock those barriers to faith out. The nature of much online discussion can be quite harsh, that we must always remember 1 Peter 3; 15-16 to give reason for our hope but do so in a gentle and respectful way. When we get sucked in to emotive and pejorative language we cease to represent Jesus well.

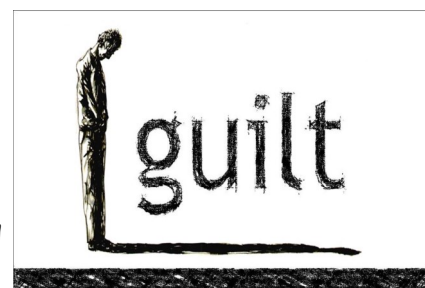


During the course of my work i meet many people, none more so than when I do my Wednesday Bits & Bobs stall . Meeting all sorts of people we are constantly amazed at the struggles and troubles that people live with. People can be downbeat or anxious but sometimes we experience somebody who is clearly angry, often with good reason. We met such a person this week. It is wisest just to listen. Getting things off our chest can be very beneficial but taking



anger to Jesus is the wisest choice of all. We can trust to cast our troubles on to him and know that he will take upon himself our burdens. During the conversation he mentioned the word sin which made me wonder had he got some Christian experience because the use of the word sin outside of a church community is very rare in common parlance, other than for diets or chocolates. There seemed a stirring within him and my prayer is that we will meet him again .

We had another conversation with a lady who expressed deep guilt. She had done something a few years ago for which she felt very ashamed. We often speak in Christian circles about forgiving others but one of the hardest things can be forgiving ourselves. Guilt can be something we find hard to shake off and it can be a terrible psychological burden, even when the other person has forgiven us. We spoke to her about Jesus, the importance of prayer and its ability to bring inner healing. We also invited her to Church. Having a supportive group of people who carry spiritual wisdom around us can make a real positive difference to our lives.



Another lady who i have known for a long time has shown an interest in the bible. For some reason we have never spoken of faith before. I have recently shared some verses and she has been quite amazed with what the bible has to say. I have continued reading a short bible passage with her each week. The words are ringing true with her. We pray for all those we come into contact with, that the Lord will touch them in some way.

Our next outreach will again be at Wickham Market Hill on Saturday September 21st. Hope to see you there Gods blessings Graham

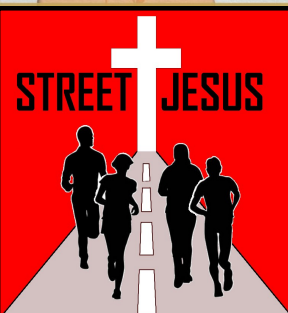
Book of the month
